Very deep pink, ruffled flowers have a dark pinkspotted throat. The profusion of blooms creates a thrilling spring specimen, excellent for use as a hedge, in borders or in a mass planting for an impressive color display. Semi-evergreen.



Reaches 2-4 feet tall; 3-5 feet wide.



Partial shade to partial sun



Water deeply, regularly during the first growing season to establish an extensive root system; once established, maintain evenly moist soil.



- Do apply annual, acidic based fertilizer. As a member of the ericaceous family, rhododendron/azalea require a lower soil ph level.
- Do provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.



- Don't plant in exposed sites.
 Best growth occurs with protection from hot afternoon sun and drying winter winds.
- Don't allow to dry out; an evenly moist root system will be quickest to establish a juvenile plant and maintain stalwarts.
