

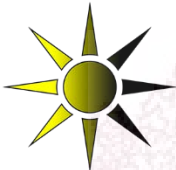
Bonanza Gold Barberry



o'Bonanza Gold' produces gracefully arching branches of gleaming yellow that is sure to light up any landscape while maintaining a small, tidy nature. Small enough for container plantings and as a facer plant, it will lend brightness anywhere it goes without sacrificing space. Often used for informal hedges, this Japanese Barberry produces inconspicuous yellow flowers in spring, and berries that persist throughout the winter. A low maintenance plant, it forms a dense mound that can be used as a specimen or foundation plant.



Moderate growing; reaches 18 inches tall; 36 inches wide.



Full Sun to Partial Shade



Water regularly - weekly, or more often in extreme heat.



- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and foliage from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.
- Do provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.



- Don't plant in high foot traffic areas; the stems are armed with stout little spines while useful under windows to deter the unlawful, they can be a pain for the unintended.
- Don't plant in too shady to a site, especially the purple cultivars. Best foliage coloration is obtained in full sun sites.
