White Barked Himalayan Birch



Exhibits the brightest white bark of any birch for a truly distinctive and exciting show! An exceptional tree with a graceful, open-branched, pyramidal form, exquisite peeling bark, and terrific fall color. Toothy, tapered, dark green foliage transforms to a bright yellow in the fall. Showy catkins drape from the tree in spring.



Quickly reaches 35-40 feet tall; 18-20 feet wide.

Water deeply, regularly during the first few growing seasons to establish an extensive root system; once established, maintain evenly moist soil.



- Do provide adequate moisture throughout growing season especially during establishment; birch as general rule will handle a generous amount of water.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above.
 Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
