Whitespire Birch



Whitespire birch is a narrow, pyramidal tree of cool climates. Bright green leaves turn a yellow fall color. Older trees develop a chalky white bark that does not peel. A good selection for poor soils and other difficult sites.



Reaches 20-40 feet tall; 10-20 feet wide.

Full sun



Water deeply, regularly during the first few growing seasons to establish an extensive root system; once established, maintain evenly moist soil.



- Do provide adequate moisture throughout growing season especially during establishment; birch as general rule will handle a generous amount of water.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above. Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".



- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
