

Hillieri Spire Cherry Tree



Narrow, upright crown with nearly vertical branches. Single, pink flowers bloom before the leaves emerge. Leaves are bronze in the spring, becoming green in the summer; Fall foliage is a mix of yellow, orange and red.



Reaches 25-30 feet tall; 18-20 feet wide.



Full Sun



Low trickle base to the root zone every other day for the first 2 weeks. Weaning to every 3rd week 1x per month; supplementing during times of drought.



- Do provide organic matter when backfilling rootball, adequate mulch layer and protection from hot afternoon sun.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and branches from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't neglect to thin the interior over time; as a member of the rose family, cherry thrives with good air circulation to interior structure.
