

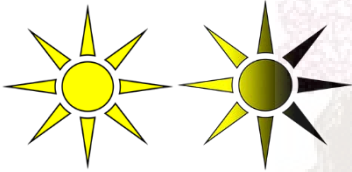
## Bailey's Redosier Dogwood



Clusters of small white flowers are followed by porcelain-blue berries that attracts birds. Lush green foliage turns reddish-purple in fall. Seasonal pruning promotes new branching with distinctive red color. An exceptional single specimen or informal hedge in a woodland setting.



Reaches 4-6 feet tall and wide.



Full Sun to Partial Shade



Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. Watering can be reduced after establishment.



- Do fertilize annually; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", avoid piling the mulch around the base and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a plant under stress.
