

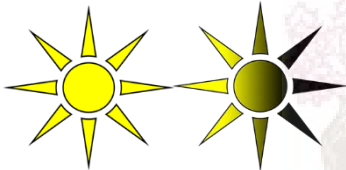
Cherokee Brave Flowering Dogwood



In spring, you'll watch this king of ornamental trees blanket itself in coral-pink to white flowers the size and shape of butterflies perched on the branch tips. Summer brings lush green foliage to shade an intimate space for dining, playing, or relaxing. Deep red leaves follow in fall, but wait—there's more! Songbirds will return again and again to gather the glossy red fruits in autumn and winter.



Reaches to 25 feet high and wide.



Full Sun to Partial Shade



Water regularly to maintain evenly moist soil - weekly, or more often.



- Do provide organic matter when backfilling rootball, adequate mulch layer and protection from hot afternoon sun.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and branches from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.
- Don't plant in an exposed site; dogwood is typically found as an understory plant, protected from high winds and harsh sunlight.
- Don't neglect to thin the interior over time; dogwood thrives with good air circulation to interior structure.
