
Ivory Halo Dogwood



Prized for its colorful stems, variegated foliage, and compact size, this dwarf dogwood has brilliant red winter stems and showy, light green leaves with creamy white margins, but at only two-thirds the size of many of its species. Use to provide multi-season interest in shrub borders, mass plantings, or as a low hedge.



Moderate growing, compact, rounded form; reaches 5-6 feet tall and wide.



Partial to Full Sun



Water regularly during first growing season to establish an extensive root system

To encourage bright red stems, annually prune to remove one-third of oldest stems, leaving strong young whips.



- Do fertilize annually; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", avoid piling the mulch around the base and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".



 Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a plant under stress.
