

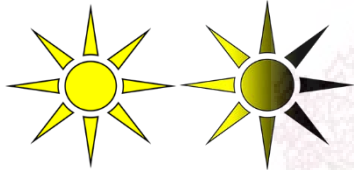
Satomi Dogwood



In late spring, the starry, strawberry-milkshake-pink flowers hold court. In summer, the lush green foliage takes over; cool weather brings spectacular purple and raspberry-red foliage to your landscape, and in winter, it's all about the marvelous jigsaw-puzzle bark. To top it all off, being a Japanese Kousa Dogwood, Satomi is pretty much immune to the pests and diseases that can trouble other Dogwood trees!



Reaches to 10-12 feet high; 15-20 feet wide.



Full Sun to Partial Shade



Water regularly to maintain evenly moist soil - weekly, or more often.



- Do provide organic matter when backfilling rootball, adequate mulch layer and protection from hot afternoon sun.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and branches from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.
- Don't plant in an exposed site; dogwood is typically found as an understory plant, protected from high winds and harsh sunlight.
- Don't neglect to thin the interior over time; dogwood thrives with good air circulation to interior structure.
