Autumn Gold Ginkgo



A very exotic looking shade tree that is tolerant of difficult conditions, seldom bothered by insects, diseases or harsh conditions Ginkgo makes an attractive and hardy tree with striking golden yellow fall color. Upright at first, eventually broadening with age. Fan shaped leaf fossils dating back more than 65 million years are identical to leaves seen today.



Slow growing; reaches 35 to 50 feet tall and wide.



Full sun



Water regularly - weekly, or more often in extreme heat.



- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above.
 Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and branches from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.



- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
