Blue Princess Holly



The hardy Blue Princess Holly makes a great shrub to give structure in your garden planting. It can be used as an informal specimen, clipped into shapes, or planted as a dense, trespass-proof hedge. If you include a plant or two of its companion, the Blue Prince Holly, it will be covered with showy, bright red berries that rest on purple stems embellished by the dense, blue-green foliage from fall through winter.



Reaches 8-10 feet tall; 6-8 feet wide.

Partial Sun



Water deeply, regularly in the first growing season to establish an extensive root system.



- Do provide antitranspirant/antidessicant in late fall. This is especially important to new plantings or exposed sites.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and foliage from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.



- Don't plant in exposed sites. Best growth occurs with protection from hot afternoon sun and drying winter winds.
- Don't neglect to provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
