

Alice Hydrangea



Among the largest of the Oakleaf Hydrangeas, this bold selection is handsome and stately for foundation or border. It has deeply lobed, oak-like leaves and a profusion of large white blooms. An added bonus, foliage turns brilliant crimson in fall.



Reaches 12 to 15 feet tall and wide.



Partial sun



Water regularly, when top 2 - 3 inches of soil is dry.



- Do prune during or directly after flowering; this will insure we are not cutting off future flowers.
- Do provide proper siting. Oakleaf hydrangea are shade oriented plants and need protection from hot afternoon sun.
- Don't place in an exposed, full sun site with minimal access to water.
- Don't forget to provide adequate mulch and annual fertilizer.
