
Wee White Hydrangea



This cute little landscape plant ensures that any landscape can enjoy the reliability, low-maintenance, and season-long beauty of hydrangeas. It reaches just 1-2.5' (.3-.7 m) tall and naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound. Each flower emerges a soft, blush pink before changing to white, and is held up on a strong, supportive stem for a display that looks more like a bouquet of flowers than a landscape plant. Blooming begins in early summer and continues through frost, with new flowers appearing the whole time.



Water regularly to maintain evenly moist soil - weekly, or more often.



- Do prune regularly; this will result in a much sturdier framework, capable of holding up the massive flower heads.
- Do prune in late fall or winter. This will avoid cutting off next season's blooms before they've had a chance.



- Don't forget to provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
- Don't prune plants too early or you run the risk of cutting off future blooms.
