

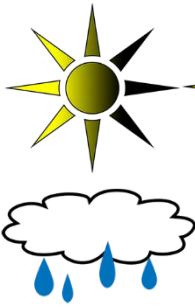
Bloodgood Japanese Maple



Attractive foliage with burgundy red coloring turns brilliant scarlet in fall. The interesting red-black bark provides striking interest in winter. This slender, airy tree is well-suited for use as a small lawn tree or for patios and entryways. One of the hardiest of Japanese maples, with good sun tolerance. Deciduous.



Slowly reaches 15 to 20 feet tall, 15 feet wide.



Filtered to full sun

Water deeply, regularly in first growing season to establish an extensive root system; reduce frequency once established.



- Do keep pruning to a minimum; other than an odd branch here or there and deadwood you are free off such a task with this tree.
- Do fertilize annually; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease. Apply slow-release fertilizer in early spring.
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
