Miss Kim Korean lilac



This upright, compact lilac blooms later than others, extending the season with deep purple buds that reveal clusters of highly fragrant, lavender-blue flowers. Foliage is burgundy-tinged in fall. Hardy, great for border accent or mass planting.



Reaches 6-8 feet tall and wide, or more with age.





Full to Partial Sun



Water deeply, regularly during the first few growing seasons to establish an extensive root system; once established, maintain evenly moist soil.

Remove spent flowers to promote continued bloom



- Do prune after flowering to avoid cutting off next season's blooms.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and foliage from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.



- Don't plant in too shady of a site; lilacs in general need access to hot afternoon sun.
- Don't neglect to provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
