

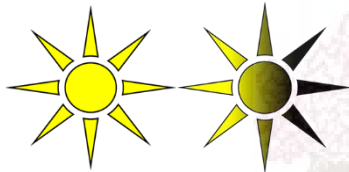
Yellow Bird Magnolia



Yellow, upright flowers are produced later than some cultivars. Yellow Bird Magnolia is blanketed in stunning fragrant yellow cup-shaped flowers held atop the branches in mid spring before the leaves. It has dark green foliage throughout the season. The large pointy leaves turn coppery-bronze in fall. The fruits are showy pink pods displayed in early fall.



Reaches 40 feet high; 25 feet wide.



Full Sun to Partial Sun



Once established, needs only occasional watering.



- Do keep pruning to a minimum; other than an odd branch here or there and deadwood you are free off such task with this tree.
- Do fertilize annually in spring when the flower buds begin to swell; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease.
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
