

Chanticleer Pear



Exquisite flowering tree displays a dazzling profusion of white flowers in early spring. Narrow, pyramidal form is coated with dark green summer foliage turning brilliant reddish-purple in fall. Ideal specimen tree for areas with limited space



Moderate growth to 30 to 35 feet tall; 15 feet wide.



Full Sun



Needs regular watering - weekly, or more often in extreme heat.

Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring.



- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above. Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and branches from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.



- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
- Don't neglect to thin the interior over time; as a member of the rose family, pear thrives with good air circulation to interior structure.
