Eastern White Pine



The Eastern white pine is a tree for landscapes with ample space. Its fine feathery needles, open canopy, and straight trunk get more picturesque with age. Trees are fast-growing and long-lived. This is Michigan's state tree.



Reaches to 50-80 feet high; 20-40 feet wide.

Full sun to Partial sun



Water deeply, regularly during the first growing season to establish an extensive root system; once established, reduce frequency.



- Do fertilize annually; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease.
- Do keep pruning to a minimum; other than an odd branch here or there and deadwood you are free off such a task with this tree.



- Don't prune central leader; the classic evergreen shape is meant to shed snow and ice.
- Don't fertilize or prune too late in the season; we want new growth to harden off before the season first frost.
