Drift Roses



Drift® roses are the result of a cross between groundcover roses and miniature roses, and the result is a compact rose that's perfect for growing in containers, at the front of landscape beds, or as a groundcover. Drift roses bloom almost continuously and offer flower colors that include apricot, peach, pink, coral, red, and pale yellow that turns to white. They generally have good disease resistance and require less spraying than hybrid tea roses.



Reaches 18 inches tall; 2-3 feet wide.



Full Sun

Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish an extensive root system - weekly, or more often in extreme heat.

Prune annually to shape and promote vigorous new growth. Pruning time: late winter or early spring, after danger of frost.



- Do fertilize annually, along with pruning your rose plantings will reward for many years.
- Do site in full sun, best growth flower are achieved with afternoon sun.



- Don't neglect to thin the interior over time; the rose family thrives with good air circulation to interior structure.
- Don't neglect to provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
