Serbian Spruce



Tall and slender, with graceful upswept branches, the Serbian spruce is an elegant evergreen tree as a specimen in the landscape. It has glossy dark green needles with slender streaks of white and distinctive purple cones. It is a threatened species in its native Serbia, Bosnia, and Herzegovina, but is an adaptable, drought tolerant tree in the Midwest.



Reaches 50-60 feet high; 20-25 feet wide.





Full Sun to Partial Shade



Water regularly - weekly; less once established, more in extreme heat.





- Do fertilize annually; a healthy plant is the best defense from pest/disease.
- Do keep pruning to a minimum; other than an odd branch here or there and deadwood you are free off such task with this tree.
- Don't prune central leader; the classic evergreen shape is meant to shed snow and ice.
- Don't fertilize or prune too late in the season; we want new growth to harden off before the season first frost.
