

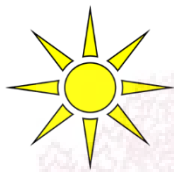
## Gro Low Sumac



A tough, fast-growing groundcover for slopes or banks, and areas with poor, dry soil. The glossy, green foliage displays an excellent red fall color and is fragrant when brushed against or leaves are crushed. Works well in border plantings, backed by taller shrubs and perennials.



Quickly reaches 2 to 3 feet tall, spreading 6 to 8 feet wide.



Partial to Full sun



Water deeply, regularly during the first growing season to establish an extensive root system; once established, reduce frequency.



- Do provide adequate drainage and avoid “clay bowls” that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
- Do prune out deadwood. Dead limbs or stems may be pruned anytime to help keep overall vigor.
- Don't prune in summer; we prune in winter to avoid any disease milling about and because sap flow is at a minimum.
- Don't over fertilize. This is a cultivar of our native plant and it grows here without much extra effort after establishment.
