

# Worpelsden Sweetgum



A superior shade tree cultivar; cold tolerant to approximately -29 degrees and smoother, less corky bark than the species. A striking pyramidal to oval form offers a vertical accent to the landscape. Narrow, deeply lobed, light-green, glossy foliage turn an artistic pallet of apricot-orange to purple in the fall. This outstanding specimen will instantly make it the focal point of any landscape.



Reaches 40 Feet High; 20 Feet Wide.



Full Sun



Low trickle base to the root zone every other day for the first 2 weeks. Weaning to every 3<sup>rd</sup> week 1x per month; supplementing during times of drought.



- Do provide adequate drainage and avoid “clay bowls” that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4”, your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above. Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate “mulch volcano”.
- Don’t forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
- Don’t plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
