
Tulip Tree



Beautiful large garden tree with unique bluish-green leaves gives spectacular show of yellow fall color. In warm season, displays handsome tulip-shaped greenish-yellow and orange flowers.



Quickly reaches 50+ feet tall; 30+ feet wide. It's Michigan's tallest tree!

Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system, after which watering can be reduced.

Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring. Pruning time: winter.



- Do provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
- Do apply mulch to a depth of 3-4", your mulch ring should be the same diameter as the canopy above. Avoid piling the mulch around the trunk and creating the unfortunate "mulch volcano".



- Don't forget to do an annual inspection looking for any deadwood or damage seasonally.
- Don't plant too deep; pay attention to the root flare in relation to the surrounding grade. A tree too high or deep will result in a tree under stress.
