

Spilled Wine Weigela



Spilled Wine has dark red, wavy leaves and a spreading habit. Its hot pink-magenta flowers are similar to those of Wine & Roses, but this is a smaller plant that is wider than it is tall. Its foliage, a dark black-purple with an attractive wavy margin, will not fade to green like some older selections. Old-fashioned weigela fills gardens with bright tubular flowers in early summer often blooming again as the season progresses. Summer foliage is neat and tidy, relatively disease free. The flowers are adored by Hummingbirds!



Reaches 1 -2 feet tall; 2-3 feet wide.

Once established, seldom needs watering. In hot or dry climates, supplemental watering is required.



- Do prune directly after flowering to avoid cutting off next season's potential blooms.
- Do use sharp, clean tools when pruning; ragged stems and foliage from dull tools leaves your plants open to various pest and disease.



- Don't plant in exposed sites. Best growth occurs with protection from hot afternoon sun and drying winter winds.
- Don't neglect to provide adequate drainage and avoid "clay bowls" that are notorious for holding water and predisposing plants to the compost heap.
